New Model Uploads

Our new models include the usual wide range of topics. Dinuka Herath provides two models of goal attainment and problem solving, focusing on disorganization and team structure. Salwa Ismail has developed a model of civil revolution and protests. Bashar Ourabi's model examines policies that can foster innovation and 'brain gain'. And Marco Janssen has uploaded a model about fish and gold, in which a choice to fish or mine gold can have ecological consequences, and agents are permitted to choose their activities based on pure (selfish) rational behavior or by switching among optimizing, repetition, imitation or inquiry (termed the 'consumat approach').

Most Downloaded Models

Eagle-eyed readers and devoted fans of the CoMSES Digest will recall that last quarter's download statistics were high: "... almost double the average...". This quarter the

total downloads returned to something closer to 'normal'. We are inspecting the numbers a bit more closely, and will be digging a little bit deeper into the download statistics in upcoming issues. There is a reason to suspect that some of our downloads are performed by 'bots'; this is actually almost a certainty, given that, by some estimates, over half of Internet traffic is actually bot-driven. This month's top downloads include a model that is currently in an 'unpublished' state; access to it is limited on the openabm model archive, but anyone with a direct link can still download it, and any bot that finds a link to it on another site can do so as well.

New Model Uploads

Simulation of the Effects of Disorganization on Goals and Problem Solving

Dinuka Herath

This is a model of the occurrence of disorganization and its impact on individual goal setting and problem-solving. This model therefore, explores the effects of disorganization on goal achievement.

Team Problem Solving and Motivation Under Disorganization *Dinuka Herath*

The model combines the two elements of disorganization and motivation to explore their impact on teams. Effects of disorganization on team task performance (problem solving).

Towards an Agent-Based Model for Civil Revolution: Modeling Emergence of Protesters, Military Decisions, and Resulting State of *Salwa Ismail*

This paper builds on a basic ABM for a revolution and adds a combination of behaviors to its agents such as military benefits, citizen's grievances, geographic vision, empathy, personality type and media impact.

Policy Formulation for Public Administration - Innovation Bashar Ourabi

Innovation a byproduct of the intellectual capital, requires a new paradigm for the production constituents. Human Capital HC,Structural capital SC and relational capital RC become key for intellectual capital and consequently for innovation.

Marco A Janssen

Lakeland 2 is a simple version of the original Lakeland of Jager et al. (2000) Ecological Economics 35(3): 357-380. The model can be used to explore the consequences of different behavioral assumptions on resource and social dynamics.
